From the Agronomy Desk...

As we move closer to fall here are a few things to keep in mind.

From corn tasseling it's about 45 days till corn silage and 60 days till the corn black layer. This is as long as we continue to get average or above average growing degree units. With how the planting of corn went this year and how spread out it was, harvest is looking to follow the same way. If you think you are getting close, we can do a burn down to see where you are at for moisture.

Wheat, oats and rye are starting to be harvested. Remember, if you have under seeding under one of these crops now would be the time to fertilize it. If there is no under seeding, this might be the year to try a cover crop. Also late summer seeding should be done by August 20th and cover crop seeding by at least the middle of September. We should get our winter wheat, rye or triticale in the ground by October.

Now might be the time to think about the precision part of cropping and how variable rate applications of fertilizer and ag lime can save you money.

If you are in need of winter rye or winter wheat seed now would be the time to place your order as these products could be hard to come by as we get into fall.

Creamy Cucumber Salad

Ingredients:

2 large Cucumbers peeled and sliced

1 sweet onion (optional)

1 Tablespoon sea salt

Dressing:

1 ½ Cups mayonnaise, or more to taste

2 tablespoons vinegar

1 tablespoon white sugar

1 teaspoon dried dill weed

1 teaspoon garlic

1 teaspoon ground black pepper

Cover Crop Seeds are Available

Radish, peas, clover, ryegrass, oats, triticale, turnips, and mixes

Plant to produce nitrogen, scavenge nutrients, and build soil

Winter Wheat & Fall Rye

Seed should be ordered early so that when planting time is here, you can head to the field instead of to town to get what seed we have left.

Directions

1. Mix cucumbers, onion and salt together in a bowl. Cover with plastic wrap and let sit 15-30 minutes

2. Turn cucumber mixture into colander. Let drain for 15-30 minutes and transfer drained mixture into a large bowl

3. Whisk mayonnaise, vinegar, sugar, dill weed, garlic powder and pepper together in a bowl until smooth. Pour over cucumber mixture and stir until covered.

4. Cover with plastic wrap and refrigerate for 1-2 hours before serving
