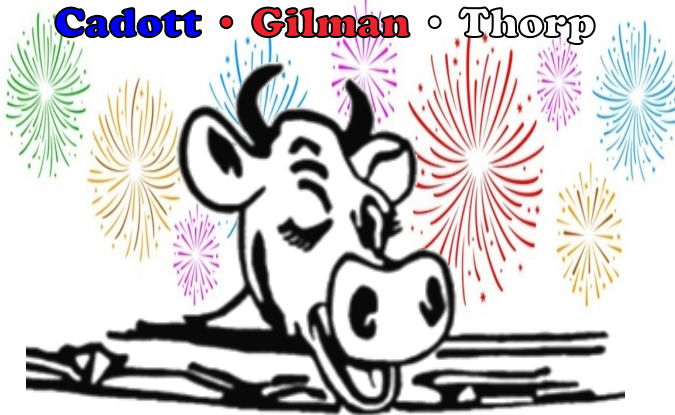

From the Agronomy Desk...

As we start the second half of 2024, we have just begun to get rolling on topdressing corn fields these past few weeks between rain storms. With all the rain we've gotten, it would not hurt to put some extra nitrogen on this year as some has washed away. If you have concerns that you have lost some nitrogen, let us know and we can come check things out.

Right now, we are working with Mother Nature to get the pre- and post-emerge spraying done due to the wet weather. We do not want to tear up your fields if we don't have to, and hopefully by the time you are reading this it will have dried out and we have those acres done.

We have found some small water hemp plants. If you think you have them in your field let us know and we can help identify it. It is easier to control water hemp under 4" tall versus 6" tall.

Just a quick reminder that if you are going to do any fall seeding of alfalfa or grasses, they should be in the ground by the middle of August. If you are planning cover crops, now would be a good time to get that seed ordered. Cover crops have shown they're worth it in helping to hold soils and build soil health. Seed supply could get tight going into fall.

Corn and soybeans:

Henry Burkholder Jr.; 3 miles south of Thorp on Hwy M,
3 miles east on Hwy N.

Soybeans: 1/4 mile further east of N, north side.

Corn: South of Bachelors Ave, east side

HEAT-RELATED ILLNESS

- STAY HYDRATED**

Reapply sunscreen often
